From the desk of Pastor Skip:

Several nights ago, I accompanied about 20 members of our new Lutheran Campus Ministry at St. John's to a San Antonio Missions game. Setting in the stands with my broken arm, I dreamed of my days on the mound. What great memories of pitching Little League and Pony League games as a youth. What brought most of those memories on was interesting. The pitcher for the Fresno Roughriders was throwing high. He was having trouble keeping the ball low in the strike zone and I sensed trouble. Sure enough, an early exit and a win for the Missions. At one point with a Mission on first base and a left handed batter at the plate, I said to myself, "I bet coach will call for hit and run." Sure enough!

I do know baseball. I know its rules, strategies and lingo. Thanks, no doubt to a father who spent many hours with me not only in the back yard but also in Bush Stadium, St. Louis. As for other sports, like soccer which my daughters played competitively as youngsters, I'm lost. That isn't football to me. And I'm utterly clueless in games like lacrosse. For awhile in my military career, I was the Lacrosse Team

Chaplain while at the Air Force Academy and even there I had to admit I had no idea what was happening on the playing field.

This is, of course, a metaphor for modern life. I know a few things well, but as technology advances, information pours in, and our economy and politics go global, my field of cluelessness expands daily. I would be lost without my desktop computer but admit that I barely understand it. I own equipment that I can't repair, and yet life seems to work. How? Through collaboration. Other people fill in my gaps. They do what I can't. I return the favor. None of us needs to know it all. It helps to have some expertise, but the critical ingredient in all the church's success is collaboration: people working together. The key to collaboration isn't skill but a desire to engage others, a willingness to share praise, humility of attitude, transparency of motivation, respect and truth.

Interview of Mary Hestilow

Mary Hestilow, daughter of Kristin Grayson had developed an interest in traveling and visiting other countries while traveling with her mother. She was introduced to Asian countries when she sought a year of studies during high school in Taiwan after a short visit to Japan through Rotary Club. Her Chinese language skills grew and she was motivated to learn more.

Mary began her college career at St. Mary's University in San Antonio, with majors in Economics and Chinese. She also met a Chinese college professor and mentor, who encouraged her with her studies. After two years, she transferred to the University of Oklahoma and has been awarded a scholarship to study in Xian China. It is in Xian that the Terra Cotta Warriors and Horses dating back to 210 BC were discovered in 1974 by local farmers. It is a sight not to be missed by any visitor to China – especially Mary!

She will be embarking on this year long study in China, leaving the US on August 26, a few short weeks away. This will be a long flight, approximately 25 hours, plus China is almost a full day (time-wise) ahead of our time. She is excited about this scholarship to study in the Xian International Studies, University of Xian, China within the Chinese Studies program.

We ask that you remember Mary in your prayers, during her stay in China; for her safety and her studies, and safe return home. Having had my own daughter who was in the Peace Corp for two years in Morocco, I am sure Mary will be missed by her Mom. If Kristin can share her address once she is in China, some of you might send a card or short letter to Mary while she is gone.

Mary will be returning to the United States at the end of June, 2011. Perhaps we could invite her for an information session about her studies and sites she has visited, when she returns.

This should be the Christian faith's province. We, of all people, should promote service to others, humility, goodness and respect. Those are biblical values. Most Christians, at one time or another, have seen collaboration work, particularly during a crisis. And especially now—with church leaders and members who casually inflame passions to form cadres of like-minded members who battle other leaders and members with cadres of like-minded members—hey, stop, the only thing we need promote is Jesus' call to oneness and self-sacrifice.

As it happens, some religious leaders lead the cheers for hatred, exclusion and scapegoatism, some with a zeal that frightens even their religious allies. Others have turned inward, into an institutionalism that shows little awareness of the questions people are asking. Still others combine the two: stirring hatred to gain power within a denomination.

At this very moment our fellowship at St. John's needs us. We do not need those who either fan the flames or hide from them. We don't need those who restrain with words of "We've never done it that way." or "We've always done it this way." What we need is to understand each other and our abilities to adapt to change. Some of us even equate our opinion with love of God and judgment with love of neighbor. Our church needs better from us. Not better doctrine, not better opinions, and not moral crusades that end up demonizing the other guy. Our fellowship needs us to show the way in working together and getting along. We need, therefore, some basic instruction in field collaboration and baseball teamwork.

Let's start by walking out the church door and into the ballpark. The night I went with Lutheran Campus Ministry, I heard several languages, ate three types of ethnic food, watched people of every sort and felt part of something good. Here we were, 2500 people happily sharing a common experience with no rancor, no barriers, no placards denouncing anyone, no zealots proclaiming some "agenda", and no one claiming to be superior. Just folks being together.

Here are the basics of "ball park" collaboration:

- First Inning – Engage Others – visit with each other
outside 502 E. Nueva.
- Second Inning – Share With Others – space, tools,
ideas, praise, abilities.
- Third Inning – Practice Humility – endless battles over
right opinions convey only the
absence of humility.
- Fourth Inning – Listen – throw your arms around the
imagination of someone else.
- Fifth Inning – Transparent Motivation – never hide
your intentions.
- Sixth Inning – Respect Others – one's personal
preferences should never be confused
with divine revelation.
- Seventh Inning – Commit Yourself To Truth – be a
blessing to others.
- Eighth Inning – Welcome All Kinds Of People – there
is no "belonging" when you seek
your own way.
- Ninth Inning – Rejoice In Failure – You have learned a
lesson you could have been
taught no other way.
