

AWARD CRITERIA

- **Active membership at St. John's**
- **Degree of activity involvement**
- **Financial need**
- **Unique qualities or capabilities**

Special notes:

- Applicants should be full-time students (minimum of 12 hrs undergraduate, 9 graduate)
- Previous recipients may apply
- Members beginning or continuing college or university studies at a "non-traditional age" are eligible and are encouraged to apply
- Award recipients should present evidence of good standing to the Scholarship Committee at the end of the first semester.

AWARD SELECTION

Using the above criteria, the Scholarship Committee will recommend awards to church council for final approval. Scholarships are ranked competitively. CAP awards are non-competitive

Betty Tieken Pieper Scholarship

Established in 1975 by Wanda Tieken for her daughter, the earnings are to be awarded to attending and active members of this Church who are in their freshman, sophomore, junior, or senior years of their college career and who show academic promise and stability. Awards are to be made without regard to sex, race, ethnic origin, or major subject studied, and applicants may attend any college or university. Two scholarships per year are to be awarded:

- Female applicant
- Male applicant

Lydia Franke and Elsie Franke McComb Educational Trust Fund

Established by the Family of Lydia Franke McComb in 1993, the earnings are to be awarded to those seeking an academic degree, either undergraduate or graduate. Recipients are to be active members of this Church who have an educational goal of service to humankind.

Established in 1998 by Doris B. Brown to fund four scholarships. Awards are for worthy individuals to attend colleges or universities located in the State of Texas, and are to be determined by the appropriate governing bodies of this Church. The scholarships are to be known as follows:

- *Josephine Friedrichs Ballard Scholarship*
- *Ed R. Ballard Scholarship*
- *Charlie L. Brown Scholarship*
- *Doris B. Brown Scholarship*

FINANCIAL AID

Congregational Aid Program (CAP) and Texas Lutheran University

This is a partnership with Texas Lutheran University to provide aid to any member of this Church who attends that University. St. John's Lutheran Church is enrolled in the CAP, which provides a student with financial award per semester for a maximum of eight semesters.

SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS

1. Active member of St. John's
2. A significant record of activity involvement at St. John's
3. A scholastic record indicating ability to complete the educational program chosen
4. Financial need

PROCEDURES

1. Pick up application from St. John's Business Office.
2. Submit complete application packet, including official transcript(s).
