Caring Enough to Give Your...

Hello St. John's!

It's been my pleasure to serve as your Visitation Pastor these past few months. I'm grateful for your warm welcome and the wonderful friendships we're beginning to build.

In the next few issues of the Tidings, I'll tell you a bit about myself and some of the exciting plans and opportunities for growing SJLC's caring ministry.

I grew up in southern Minnesota in the Norwegian branch of the Lutheran Church. My childhood experiences, and the examples of my Aunt Hazel and my Grandpa Lunning, helped shape my faith and my understanding of what it means to be a church.

What does being a church mean to you? Some of us might say church is a place. For example, "I go to church at St. John's."

Others of us might describe church as a denomination; "I go to St. John's **Lutheran** Church."

Still others of us might talk about church in terms of service to our community. "I go to St. John's, where they have the nursery and day school."

There are as many different ways of talking about church as there are people. So, what about the Bible, does the Bible say anything about what it means to be a church?

The Bible has many helpful things to say about what it means to be a church. In the coming months we'll explore Bible verses, experiences of the first Christian church, and lessons from our own SJLC history to better understand what it means to be a caring church—a church that seeks to be Christ's heart in the heart of the city.

Have you heard the story about two men who started a conversation at the local coffee shop? As the conversation turned to work, one man explained he was the new pastor at the Lutheran church just down the street. "How about that!" the other man said. "I'm a member of that church."

Puzzled, the pastor replied, "Well, I've been at the church for 18 months now, but I don't remember ever seeing you there."

"Now, Pastor," the other man said, "I said I was a 'member' not a fanatic."

However we might describe what it means to be a caring church, I suspect we could agree that being a church member who cares means something more than stopping by to visit every other year or so.

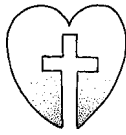

FROM THE THEOLOGICAL HEADQUARTERS OF:

Fellow Christ followers, grace and peace to you from the greater Mid-west:

I write to you as the cold northern winds blow and the end of my third semester of seminary at Wartburg comes to a close. This semester has sought to engross its students in the practices and definitions of what it means to be a Lutheran Christian as well as learning and reading Hebrew. We, as a second year class, have diligently studied countless stories of the Old Testament, reviewed and critiqued church education materials and practices, and even deliberately engaged youth in how they learn, grow in faith, and develop their identity. (And that was just on Mondays!) Amidst all the chaos that is class and homework, it has been a joy to be in a community that centers itself on the spiritual renewal of its students, faculty, and staff as well as pastoral preparation and growth. I cherish the moments I spend with classmates in theological debate and look forward to next semester and a new round of classes.

As of October 29, 2009, I was endorsed and recommended to move on to the next step of seminary, internship. At the commencement of the spring semester, Wartburg's Internship Committee will meet and final placement for each candidate will be decided. As a class, we will know our location for the next year by the middle to end of March. I wait with great anticipation and excitement to find out where the Spirit-driven persons will send me next. I have allowed myself, at least in thought and prayer, to be open to anything that might come my way. While this invokes a slight sense of fear, I know that no matter the location, God will use the congregation, its members, and the community to help me learn and grow.

If you remember back to January of this year I had the opportunity to travel to Guyana, South America where I lived and worked as a "pastor-in-training" with pastors of the E.L.C.G. While I will not be traveling south of the equator again this January, the winds of foreign travel have blown across my cluttered desk. From the 7th-22nd, 20 members of Wartburg, the surrounding community, and myself will travel from Newark, New Jersey to Israel. For 13 days we will live amongst the Israeli Christians, specifically Lutherans, studying the ancient sites of the Holy Land. We will tour the numerous churches in Jerusalem, walk the streets of Jesus' hometown of Nazareth, and float around in the Dead Sea. Leading this group is Wartburg's own Dr. Ann Fritschel, professor of Hebrew and Old Testament studies. I am blessed that I can partake in this once in a life-time opportunity with someone who has not only studied these ancient sites extensively and traveled them on countless trips but has lived within the very areas of our travels. Dr. Fritschel brings the gifts of knowledge, humor, and joy to our travels and I look forward to sharing my stories with you upon my return.

From the bottom of my heart I wish I had the space to thank you personally for all that you have done for me. Through your thoughts, prayers, and financial assistance, you have made my vocational dream a true reality. By God's grace and Spirit I hope that I can touch the lives of a person someday just as you have touched mine. I pray that God has filled your Advent time with ardent anticipation of the coming child, your Christmas time with joyous celebration of the birth of our Savior, and your New Year with wondrous excitement about the year to come!

Congregation Council Meeting
October 19, 2009

Pastor's Report:

1. Confirmation has begun with ten students.

Roger Steckly moved the recommended list of persons be received into membership; Mike Arnold seconded; motion passed.

Activities for the church Christmas Party December 20 were described. Council members received their parts for a Reader's Theater presentation of "The Best Christmas Pageant Ever." There will be a luncheon followed with a San Antonio Chamber Choir Concert at 2:30 p.m.

Treasurer's Report: None, but the budget is ready.

Day School Report: none

Standing Committee Reports:

1. Finance. Ken Taggart reported that the budget format has changed and called attention to items below the line which describe sources of funds available to offset the deficit. In the Day School budget, included for the first time, finance deleted some staff benefits and an equipment purchase, for a balance of +\$7200. Both boilers need to be re-tubed and both expansion tanks for Ajax Hot Water Boiler need to be replaced. The estimated cost is between \$23,000 and \$24,000 for all of these and the funds to be taken from Capital Reserve.
2. Property and Grounds. General overview by Albert Tietze, with main expense being the new boiler.
3. Christian Education. Written report.
4. Stewardship. Muriel Leafstedt reported that as of 10/15, 45 pledge cards have been returned for a total of \$91,052.
5. Worship, Music, and Arts. Roger Steckly reported that Dr. Fischer is writing a book for advent devotions and asked for one remaining volunteer. He called attention to the new banners for the west transept. The committee's main work has been to prioritize the budget, using the following categories:
 - a. Mission critical
 - b. Mission supportive
 - c. Mission optional
 - d. Transfer to special project.

In response to multiple requests, donations will be taken for a new Christmas tree.

6. Youth/Family. Pastor Courter said the Luther League will gather to go on the bus to Lutheran Coronation. They will be involved with the coming sausage supper and cemetery cleanup.
7. Personnel. Declaration of 2009 Housing Allowance by Pastor Steven C., Lunning – IRS Requirement: It is hereby resolved that the amount from the compensation which is paid for the period beginning July, 2009 and ending December 31, 2009 shall be designated as rental/housing allowance within the meaning of that term as used in Section 107 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 for the following: Pastor Steven C. Lunning 35% of salary

Resolved, that the designation for the above amount of his annual compensations as housing allowance also shall apply to all future years that the he is employed by St. John's Lutheran Church, unless otherwise provided before the first payroll of any given year.

President's Report: Albert Tietze read the letter dated September 9, 2009, from the South Texas Synod declaring the approval of our constitution. Zion Lutheran Church is closing on November 10, 2009. A letter noted equipment available.

Business:

1. Topic: Interpretation of wording of staggered terms as in newly approved constitution. Following discussion, Mike Arnold moved and Roger Steckly seconded that the words "date elected" mean just that and not the date terms begin; that we move into compliance with the constitution by extending the term of the Vice President and the Treasurer by one year, and that we elect the President and Secretary in 2010, as well as half the council in 2010. Motion passed.
2. Alpha Omega is not ready for action at this time.
3. Agenda for Fall Congregation Meeting was distributed and ratified.
4. Caroline Nentwich moved and Carole Cauble seconded that the 2010 Budget be proposed to the congregation. President Tietze explained the rationale for the form of the budget as printed. Motion passed.
5. President Tietze read Bishop Tiemann's letter following the passage of the ELCA statement on Clergy.

Ken Taggart gave the closing prayer. Meeting adjourned by general consent at 9 p.m.
