"The heart of Christ...in the heart of the City."

from the desk of Pastor Skip

A student of Martin Luther once asked the esteemed Professor, "Where was God before the creation of the world?" Luther replied, "God was making hell for those who ask silly questions like this." What Luther was actually saying was quite simple. We do well to concentrate our efforts on what God has disclosed to us about Himself and not give a second thought to those matters He hasn't revealed. To speak endlessly of our human speculation about God is pointless. Luther, above all, was frustrated by his contemporaries who continually shared their combined ignorance. He commented, "Academic rhetoric but does not lead anyone to salvation." It was sort of a slap in the face to his own profession.

The God who raised Jesus from the dead doesn't really ever reveal much about His "Godness." God in the Old Testament appears in the mask of specific events linked to the history of Israel. And in the New Testament, Jesus becomes the most dominant mask in history. We Christians talk of a God who descends. This is offensive to all other world religions who profess a powerful "other-worldly" god to whom we humans must ascend either by moral achievement or idle speculation. But the Father of Jesus Christ joins us humans in the time between our birth and death. Jesus, Himself, arrives through a refugee family, grows up amid the ordinary, and ends life gasping for breath between two thieves.

"What is above us is none of our business," Luther told the philosopher Erasmus of Rotterdam. Erasmus speculated about the "Godness of God." He wrote of how God might exercise divine power, whom God might love or not love, and many other aspects of divine being. To Luther such speculation was an example of idolatry, playing God with the power of human reason. Luther commented that this is the truest expression of original sin and illustrated his point in the story of the serpent who wooed Adam and Eve with the temptation "to be like God."

Luther insisted that proper God-talk focus on the God disclosed in Jesus rather than on the God imagined beyond Jesus. "Learn Christ and him crucified," Luther told a puzzled friend. "To seek God outside Jesus is the Devil. Theologians become fools when they investigate mysteries which ought only to be worshipped. As a result, many break their necks." Luther always had a way with words!

It was Luther's study of St. Paul and his reflections on the Old Testament book of Habakkuk that led him to the discovery of a God who "crossed the bridge," embodied himself in Jesus of Nazareth and descended to ungodly people in unconditional love. Luther concluded that God had come in Christ to take away the burden of guilt and replace it with the promise of being accepted without merit. It was Luther's "born again" experience.

To be wooed into such a faith is the love story of Christianity. Again and again in the Bible we encounter story after story of the God who woos us humans back into a new and living relationship with Him that is beyond sin and death. This is the Gospel. "Faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes by the preaching of Christ" (Romans 10:17.) Luther rediscovered that it takes two to generate faith in the merciful God: one to tell the story of what God did in Christ and another to fall in love with that story. He wrote, "Our theology is certain because it snatches us away from ourselves and places us outside of ourselves, so that we do not depend on our own strength, conscience, reason, experience, person, work or thought, but rather depend on that which is outside ourselves, that is, on the promise and truth of God revealed in Holy Scripture which can not deceive.

For Luther there is no cooperation between human effort and God's grace. Luther's key assumption is that faith in God is activated by what appears to be a personal decision but what is in reality the calling and stirring of the Holy Spirit within. Here again, it is an outside force acting upon the heart of man. It is a word from outside that promises radical change. That is the way the God of the Bible woos us like a true lover who, in the crucified Christ, offers gospel power to those who turn their hearts to the cross.

Jesus' crucifixion revealed God's descent to a world at war with its Creator. Traditional religion, however expressed, tends to drive one to strive upward in a human search for meaning, definition, and a sense of order. We must always be on guard for this temptation. Christians are cross-minded, "having the mind of Christ" (not one of their own) "who humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even the death on a cross" (Philippians 2:5-9). The cross reveals to us that our goodness will never be good enough! The cross calls us to move sideways into a world that needs to hear the story of God's descent into a human being, Jesus. This horizontal move is a challenge to what is popular; we don't worship power, success, pleasure, money, good feelings, ego gratification or trust in human achievement. We will always have the lure for a religion propelled by human reason, deliberation, and a God of our own making. But that all comes crashing down at the foot of the cross. There we are always wooed back into a covenant of eternal love by the God who hides himself in Jesus Christ. The cross calls all out hearts and our total mind to focus on what the Holy Scriptures teach us about our Creator. Where can you find the time to wander away from our true source of information, grace, and love.
