# Tidings

*From the desk of Pastor Skip:*

Since the 1960's, the work of a parish pastor has changed. I talked briefly about this last month. To be honest, being a parish pastor is an impossible task. No one can adequately fulfill all the expectations of the members of a congregation. When pastors try, they end up hurting themselves as well as others. If a pastor wanted to assume all the responsibilities of congregational living, I'm sure most congregational members would not object! But when Pastors do try to do it all, they create major problems.

Let me explain. Pastor and people must be a team. Responsibility must be shared. There is just simply too much to do in the act of "go and make disciples of all nations" for one person to do it all. One set of spiritual gifts isn't enough. We need an army! (Or an Air Force!) We are organized as a church to function in a very specific way. The pastor is called by a congregation as a coach is called to an athletic team. When a coach tries to be a player too, the results prove disastrous. A pastor is called to train and equip a team of Christians to fulfill its calling. A coach leads the team in preparing for the next game. A coach trains the players to do their job. A coach challenges the players with a vision of what they can do and become. But when the whistle blows, the coach remains on the sideline. Therefore, St. John's is a team made up of a coach and players. As your coach, my responsibility is to get the right person in the right task, to educate that person to do the task in the context of the vision and then to step back and get out of the way. That way we carry out the mission of St. John's as a team.

Here at St. John's, I have to focus all my energy on my primary responsibilities. First, I relive every day on my long drive downtown, the work of the Holy Spirit in bringing us together. I know I was ordained and called to a specific place, for a group of specific people, to do a specific set of pastoral tasks. First of these important tasks are the preaching of God's Word and the administration of the Sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion. Only an ordained, recognized, and called pastor can assume this responsibility. Next is the call to teach, particularly as it relates to how Jesus intends to use all the members of a congregation to carry out the mission to make disciples. Lastly, the pastor is called to set the congregation's vision. This is the prophetic role. Friends, I have a vision of what the Lord is calling St. John's to be and do and I inherit in that call the responsibility to determine where the congregation stands in fulfilling that vision.

What ties all three of these passions together is my call to be available to you when you need me. In that availability lays my responsibility to communicate my vision for us as a community and its inherent opportunities for ministry. What sometimes hinders that availability is the temptation to take on an array of administrative tasks and assume the role as leader of the St. John's organizational structure. But we all know that managing a staff or an organization does not require a theological education. In fact, a theological education does nothing to prepare a pastor for this role. That is why this role is carried out by the church officers and the council members you the congregation elect. As a team, pastor and people, we both have to be vigilant at keeping these tasks clearly defined.
