From the desk of Pastor Skip:

"Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work. But the seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord your God" Exodus 20:8-10

The last half of 2011 is drawing to a close and I guess I should be drafting a Christmas/New Years message to you as the headliner to the January Tidings. But I am not. In these last six months the Lord has had his hands full with me. I don't normally share outside of the Mutual Ministry Committee my deeply personal spiritual reflections and agonies but at their urging I will. And it may take me all of 2012 to disclose all I have learned from the Lord. It's all in Exodus 20, and contained in three rather small verses, 8, 9, and 10. But their impact on my life has been substantial. Maybe they will have the same effect on you.

Along this journey I have found a new spiritual mentor. His name is Wayne Muller. He has become a dear and trusted spiritual friend. We met in my Synod duties as Chairman of the Commission for Professional Leadership. He lives in New Mexico and came here to San Antonio at my invitation to speak to all the rostered leaders of this Synod last month. We have talked for hours about our lives in ministry, so much so I cannot distinguish between what we learned together and what was taught by either. But if there is any value to what you will read over the next few months, let's credit Wayne Muller. Here we go...

You and I have a problem. I probably have the biggest problem of all. I have lost the essential rhythm of life in the relentless busyness of living. It is action and accomplishment that has replaced rest as my, perhaps our, source of internal human comfort. We say things like, "I'll quit when my to do list is finally all marked off" or "I can't rest until all is done" or "Doing something is better than doing nothing." It is as if we believe good things come only through unceasing determination and tireless effort. Being alive melts into one enormous obligation. Being busy becomes the model of successful life. Exhaustion becomes a trophy and the only way to ensure sleep. Ability to withstand stress becomes equated with character so the busier we are, then obviously, the more important we are. We live in a world where overwork is a professional virtue.

Perhaps that is why the Chinese pictograph for the word "busy" is composed of two characters: the heart and **killing**.

Tired, overworked, overwhelmed people do not have the time nor the capacity to listen to the deeper voices that speak to the essence of the problems life throws at them. Tired people can only address "symptoms" and think they only have time to do what makes the problems go away. Then, more perplexing problems emerge. The quick fix is only a seed to a new problem which will grow bigger and more unmanageable. Tired, overworked, overwhelmed people do not have available to them what can only be defined as "quiet wisdom" which is our only defense from life in the survival mode.

How did this happen to us? We forgot the Sabbath! Perhaps the only reason God made keeping the Sabbath a command, one of the big ten requirements, is because we humans just too quickly forget it. What we need is a bigger picture of Sabbath.

Sabbath is not just a twenty-four hour day. It is a way of living “in time” where we remember who we are, what we know, and listen to the gifts of the Holy Spirit and the eternal Jesus. Sabbath honors the necessary wisdom in the dormancy of nature. In Sabbath we celebrate the sacred which gives way to deep mindfulness. If we do not surrender to the Sabbath we can never hear the voice that tells us the right things to do.

This leads us to an understanding of Sabbath as both a specific practice and a larger metaphor for sacred rest. It may be a Sabbath afternoon, a Sabbath hour, a Sabbath walk, or a three month Sabbath for life giving nourishment and rest. Sabbath is not absence from work. Sabbath is the presence of something that arises when we consecrate a period of time to listen to what is nourishing, something that honors grace, rest and healing.

I have long associated tremendous guilt and shame with taking time to rest. What a shame. Sabbath gives me permission, no it commands me, to stop and remember. Rest is an essential enzyme of life, as necessary as air. But much of our lives are specifically designed to seduce our attention away from the Sabbath’s inner place of rest. Every worldly stimulus competes for our attention: buy me, watch me, do me, drink me, drive me, and own me. Sabbath time is an inner refuge from that seduction, a setting aside the frenzy of consumption and the push of accomplishment.

A woman seeking healing once reached out amid a huge crowd of people and touched the hem of Jesus. Jesus immediately wanted to know who touched Him. In that crowd, how did He know He was touched? He explained, “I could feel power go out of me.” Deeply mindful of the flow of His life, Jesus could feel the expenditure of energy in every encounter.

Do we? We meet dozens of people everyday and have so many conversations. Do we feel how much energy we spend on each activity? This one little e-mail, this one extra phone call, this quick meeting, what can it cost? But it does cost. It drains one more drop of life. Then at the end of days, weeks, months, years, we collapse. It happened in a thousand unconscious events, tasks, and responsibilities that seemed easy and harmless on the surface but that each, one after the other, used a small portion of our precious life. And God said, “Remember the Sabbath to keep it holy.” If I may, I think what He meant to say was, “Remember the Sabbath to keep us holy.” He wants us to learn surrender as a silent grace.

Here is my plea for you and me at St John’s: become a Sabbath keeper so that our ministry will have the wisdom of rest within it. For when we are filled ourselves, our first impulse is to be useful, kind, and to give something away. The world aches for the generosity of a well rested St John’s community of faith. Remember the Sabbath. Breathe deeply the rhythms of life, of action, of rest and find comfort in this and every place.

Up next: Sacred Rest. Read Luke 5:15-16.

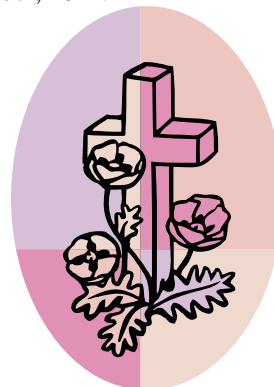

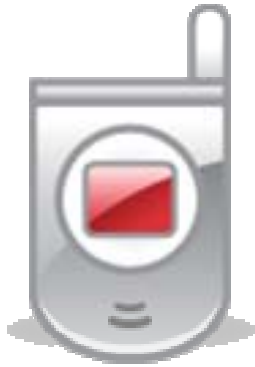

Filippa Duke, a native of Henderson, NC, is a doctoral student at the University of Kansas where she is pursuing the DMA of Church Music (Organ Emphasis). She received the Bachelor of Music degree in Organ Performance from East Carolina University where she was a student of Janette Fishell. Additional studies include the Certificate in Advanced Performance Studies from ECU and study during two residencies with Dame Gillian Weir and Ludger Lohmann. She later earned the Master of Music degree from Indiana University where she studied with Chris Young.

In addition to her collegiate studies, she participated in the summer Oundle Institute for Organists in Cambridge, England. As an undergraduate, Ms. Duke was the winner of the 2005 Eastern Carolina Chapter of the Regional competition for Young Organists and went on to place second in the Regional Competition in Columbus, Georgia. Additionally, she was a finalist in the 2007 and 2011 Arthur Poister Scholarship Competition in Organ Playing. She was recently selected to be an official competitor in the 2012 National Young Artists Competition in Organ Playing. She has played recitals in the Southeast and Midwest, mostly notably at the National Cathedral in Washington, Christ Church Cathedral, Indianapolis, and St. Philip's Cathedral in Atlanta, GA.

A passionate church musician, Ms. Duke has served many churches as an organist, choral conductor, and handbell conductor. Most recently was the Church Music Intern at West End United Methodist Church and was the 2010 recipient of the Peter M. Knock Scholarship in Church Music. Currently, Ms. Duke serves as the Director of Music/Organist at Westport Presbyterian Church in Kansas City, MO as well as the Associate Organist for the Solemn High Mass at Trinity Episcopal Church in Lawrence, KS.

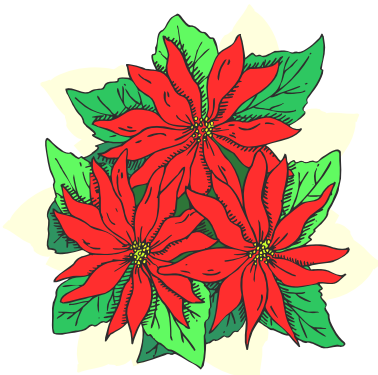


Cell Phone Collection
